Movement is an important process of how humans relate to places, generating the proximity or distance that makes a place into a landscape. Human movement has often been linked with places of special ritual or collective memory and in the contemporary world such places are often theorized as sites of 'heritage'. The present workshop will bring together researchers interested in how human movements interact with landscape. Movement will be understood in a broad sense to include migration, pilgrimage, transhumance, tourism and other forms. Papers relating to mountains and movements through mountain landscapes are especially welcome.

This workshop on Movement and Landscape is co-organized by the Mt. Fuji World Heritage Centre for Mountain Research, Shizuoka Prefecture, Japan, Research Centre of the Slovenian Academy of Sciences and Arts (ZRC SAZU) and Department of Asian Studies, Faculty of Arts, University of Ljubljana. The Mt. Fuji World Heritage Centre for Mountain Research (CMR) is a new research institute and interpretation centre to open in Fujinomiya City, Shizuoka in late 2017. This centre will aim at transdisciplinary research on Mt. Fuji and other mountains and mountain cultures, as well as on sites of heritage, especially places listed as UNESCO World Heritage.

Results from this workshop will be incorporated into an international conference provisionally titled "Moving in/to the Anthropocene: Movement and Landscape" to be held in Shizuoka in February 2018. Papers from that conference will be published by Routledge in a new monograph series titled "Environment and Civilization: Asian Anthropocene Studies".
